Year 1 (July 2023 - June 2024)

Goal 1: Membership Engagement and Support

Improve and Expand Member Services:

- Develop and launch a Performance Award System to recognise member achievements and horse accomplishments
- Promote the breeding season by showcasing our Stallion owners, their stallions, and the progeny of these stallions
- Create welcome packs to be sent to new members upon receiving their horse's new pedigree registration certificate or newly transferred certificate
- Launch the IDSHS new website featuring a society-owned pedigree register with robust technology support

Improving Pedigree Identification:

- Update pedigree identification certificates to meet current industry standards
- Introduce an official Passport for studbook horses registered horses available to already registered studbook horses
- Implement a purebred breeding program reward system to encourage and reward responsible breeding practices

Joining the Australasian Horse Breeders Federation:

 Establish IDSHS's membership in the Australasian Horse Breeders Federation to allow for collaboration and access to a broader equestrian community

Marketing and Promotion:

- Develop and implement a comprehensive marketing and promotional strategy to raise awareness of the Irish Draught and Irish Sport Horse breeds across Australia
- Seek partnerships and knowledge-sharing opportunities with sister Irish Draught and Irish Sport Horse Societies to exchange successful strategies for breed awareness and promotion

Testing both mares and stallions offers numerous advantages:

- helps identify carriers, significantly reducing the chances of producing offspring with genetic disorders
- allows breeders to make informed decisions that prevent the transmission of such disorders
- promotes genetic diversity within the breed, contributing to its overall health and vitality

safeguard the well-being and future success of the Irish Draught and Irish Sport Horse breeds

• by knowing the genetic status of both parents, breeders can make optimal pairings based on considerations of both health and performance traits



Year 2 (January 2024 - June 2025)

Goal 4: Breed Improvement and Registration

Responsible Breeding Practices:

- Promote responsible breeding practices and maintain high breed standards to uphold the integrity of the Irish Draught and Irish Sport Horse breeds
- Provide resources, educational materials, and support for breeders to enhance breeding programs and increase genetic diversity

Breeding Season Insights:

• Publish comprehensive statistical insights from the breeding season, including details on which stallions were chosen for breeding and the resulting foals during the 2022 / 2023 and 2023/2024 seasons, and beyond

Member-Inclusive Inspections:

• Create a proposal for members, seeking their suggestions and recommendations for potential inspectors of Irish horses in Australia. Given financial constraints, international inspectors may not be feasible; however, we are able to utilise breed and conformation judges across the country. These judges will offer a non-biased and impartial view on horses during inspections, focusing on conformation, temperament, movement, and performance. This approach ensures members actively participate in the advancement of studbook inspections in Australia.

Annual National Tour:

- Establish and promote the Annual National Tour of Horse Inspections, and consistently update the public studbook
- Schedule the tour for the second half of 2024 (September/October), with locations determined based on member representation and interest. Ideally, a committee representative from each state will assist in arranging locations and tour dates, with additional committee members available to travel as needed.

Elective Performance Testing:

• Introduce elective performance testing during the inspection tour, providing owners the opportunity to showcase their horses' movement and free jumping capabilities. Recognising that these horses are bred for performance, this component will ensure a comprehensive evaluation during inspections.

Results Transparency:

• Publish full results and scores of horses from the tour on the society website upon the tour's completion. This transparency allows breeders to make informed decisions regarding breeding choices and supports the exchange of insights within the breeding community.

Goal 5: Competitions and Events

Performance Awards Recognition:

• Recognise and reward the participants of the Performance Awards system at the conclusion of the 2023/2024 season with exciting prizes and merchandise

Performance Report:

• Generate a comprehensive report summarising the achievements and activities of participants in the Performance Awards system over the past 12 months. This report will provide valuable insights and marketing opportunities for Irish horse enthusiasts and breeders

Breed-Specific Shows and Championships:

• Investigate the feasibility of organising breed-specific shows and championships for Irish Draught and Irish Sport Horses. Additionally, explore opportunities for collaboration with the Connemara Society to build stronger relationships between the two organisations

Goal 6: Advancement and Growth

Educational Clinics and Seminars:

• Host educational clinics and seminars aimed at improving the knowledge and skills of members and enthusiasts. Collaborate with third-party educators, including research and development companies, product and service providers, and industry influencers, to provide valuable insights and expertise to members

Rules and Regulations Review:

• Review the current rules and operating regulations of the society and update them as needed to align with the society's vision, mission, and core values. Ensure that these regulations continue to promote responsible breeding and maintain high breed standards

Goal 7: Enhancing Breed Recognition and Visibility

Relationship Building:

• Establish and nurture relationships with relevant equestrian bodies with the goal of achieving recognition as a daughter society by Horse Sport Ireland (HSI)

This recognition will enhance the standing of the society globally

Pathway to WBFSH:

• Work in collaboration with the Australasian Horse Breeders Federation to create a pathway for the inclusion of Irish horses in Australia in the World Breeding for Sport Horses (WBFSH) rankings

Building a Profile and Promoting Irish Draughts and Irish Sport Horses in Australia

Funding and Sponsorship

We need committee members to:

Research available funding sources, including the Horse Industry Council, AHBF, and government grant opportunities

Create a sponsorship proposal that outlines the benefits of sponsoring our society, including the value of cash or product contributions and how the sponsor's brand will be promoted Manage relationship with larger sponsors

communicate what sponsors receive in return for their support, such as advertising and promotion through the society's channels. This can include:

- Website banners and links
- Email promotions
- Social media mentions
- Show schedule advertisements
- Inclusion in statistics reports
- Show class or full show sponsorship

Look for additional revenue-generating opportunities. This could include:

- Exploring philanthropic investment from industry stakeholders or individuals passionate about the breed.
- Increasing the number of memberships and registered horses. Develop marketing strategies to attract more members and registrations

Develop a compelling marketing strategy to attract sponsors. This should include a clear message about the society's mission, the breed's uniqueness, and how sponsors can be part of its growth and success.



Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) at a Glance

Membership Growth:

Measure: Count of new memberships over a specific period

Effectiveness: A positive trend indicates the success of marketing efforts and member engagement programs

Pedigree Registrations:

Measure: Number of foals and horses registered

Effectiveness: Increasing registrations demonstrate the society's relevance and attractiveness to breeders and

owners

Website Traffic:

Measure: Unique visitors, page views, bounce rate

Effectiveness: Higher traffic indicates effective online presence and interest in society activities

Social Media Engagement:

Event Participation:

Measure: Attendance numbers

Effectiveness: High participation indicates the relevance and appeal of events to members

Education Program Attendance:

Measure: Number of participants in educational programs

Effectiveness: Increased attendance suggests the success of educational initiatives

Member Satisfaction Surveys:

Measure: Scores or feedback from satisfaction surveys

Effectiveness: Positive feedback indicates a satisfied membership base

Media Mentions:

Measure: Frequency of mentions in media

Effectiveness: Increased visibility in media reflects the society's influence and recognition



Putting Plans into Action

Resource Allocation:

- Identify the resources (financial, human, and technological) required for each objective's successful implementation
- Determine how these resources will be allocated and managed

Risk Management:

• Develop a risk assessment for each objective. Identify potential obstacles or challenges that could slow progress and create strategies to mitigate these risks

Regular Updates and Stakeholder Engagement:

- Report at each bi-monthly committee meeting, with a full report to be presented at the 2024 and 2025 AGM's
- Ensure that key stakeholders, including members and sponsors, are informed about the progress and results of the plan

Sustainability:

• Consider the long-term sustainability of our strategic objectives. What will it take to maintain and build upon the progress we make during this two-year plan?

Performance Metrics:

• Develop and define key performance indicators (KPIs) for each goal's objective. KPIs will help measure success and should be specific, measurable, achievable, relevant, and time-bound (SMART)

Continuous Improvement:

• Regularly review your progress and be open to making adjustments as needed. The strategic plan should be a living document that adapts to changing circumstances.

External Environmental Scanning:

• Keep an eye on external factors that could impact the successful execution of your strategic plan, such as changes in government regulations, industry trends, or economic shifts

Celebrate Achievements:

• Recognise and celebrate milestones and achievements along the way.
